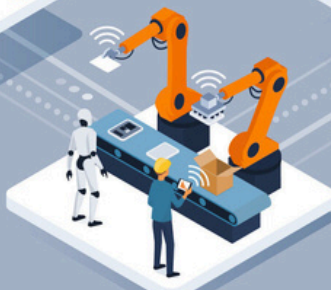

Turning Waste into Worth

At our Airport Road facility, a new waste diversion initiative is helping us minimize landfill use and give byproducts a productive second life. Teams are re-evaluating waste streams from materials such as Activated Carbon, Calcium Hypochlorite, and resins, seeking ways to transform them into new opportunities.

Already, we have found success: Divert and Floor Sweep Resin materials are now sold to a recycler that repurposes them into picnic tables, parking blocks, and park benches. What once went to landfills now supports sustainable manufacturing. This is a circular win for both the environment and the economy.

Creating a Healthier, More Efficient Work Environment

Sustainability also means improving the spaces where our people work every day. Recent upgrades at our Airport Road location include:

- **Reflective Roofing:** New Titanium White roofs help reflect sunlight, lowering interior temperatures in the summer and reducing energy consumption.
- **Enhanced Air Handling:** A modern air system in Bldg. 2 captures fine

chemical dust, improving air quality and ensuring a cleaner, safer environment for our operators.

These enhancements reinforce how environmental responsibility and employee well-being go hand in hand.

Smarter Equipment for Safer, More Sustainable Operations

At our Parkersburg, WV- Rosemar facility, we are reviving innovation to improve both efficiency and ergonomics. A previously idle pallet inverter, out of service since 2021, is being brought back online under the direction of Regional Operations Manager, Steve Sansevere.

Now operational, the inverter will make pallet handling safer and faster, reducing manual lifting, saving energy, and enhancing productivity. It is a practical example of how operational improvements can drive sustainability while strengthening customer responsiveness.

Looking Ahead

Each initiative may be incremental on its own, but together they represent the momentum of meaningful change. At TDI, sustainability isn't an initiative on the sidelines. It is embedded into how we operate, innovate, and serve.
